Cost per student: \$350 for marching season

This breaks down to **\$2.11 per hour**

- Hours calculated don't include performances at football games and competitions
- Hours calculated don't include an additional 21 hours of instruction that our leadership team members receive

## Meet Our Marching Band Instructors

Chris Rigolini is a music educator, originally from Florida, serving as the Director of Instrumental Music at Highlands Ranch High School since fall of 2018. Mr. Rigolini graduated from Florida Southern College in 2012 with his Bachelor's Degree in Music Education. He began his teaching career that same year at Jefferson High School in Tampa, FL. While in Tampa, Mr. Rigolini was in high demand as a clinician and counselor at many local schools and universities. In the spring of 2018, he received his Master's Degree in Wind Band Conducting at the Lamont School of Music at the University of Denver. His professional affiliations include the Colorado Bandmasters Association, Colorado Music Educators Association, National Association for Music Education, FBA, FOA, FMEA, and Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia. Mr. Rigolini lives in Centennial, CO with his wife Kelly, son Rory, and dog Lucy.



Zach Barker is an instructor at Blue Knights Percussion Ensemble, a drummer with Denver Broncos Stampede Drum Line, and teaches percussion at HRHS and Cherry Creek High School, as well as playing in a few local rock bands. We are glad to have him working with our Drumline and Winter Percussion groups!

Brian Ernster has many years of experience with brass and marching with Cherry Creek High School, THE University of Colorado's Golden Buffalo Marching Band, the Cal Band in Berkeley, CA, Denver's Blue Knights Drum & Bugle Corps, the Blue Devils Drum & Bugle Corps from Concord, CA, and has recently retired from 10 years with 101<sup>st</sup> Army Band of the Colorado National Guard. He is a former marching band assistant at Cherry Creek HS and Arapahoe HS and has been a General Effect and Visual judge in Band and Winter Guard competitions in Texas and Colorado. Brian is in the Army Reserves with over 23 years in various Army positions. Brian plays bass trombone with the Lone Tree Symphony Orchestra as well as various other ensembles. Brian is the brass and visual instructor with our Marching Band and works with our Winter Guard.



Kelly Rigolini currently serves as the Marketing Manager and Digital Media Specialist for the Performing Arts Academy (PAA) in Highlands Ranch. She has spent the past few years working in marketing and communications for nonprofit organizations. In those roles she reported on human rights issues and helped send medical supplies to vulnerable populations all over the world. She earned an MBA from Hult International Business School and a BA in International Studies and French Studies from American University. Throughout her life Kelly has studied dance, drama, and music and has experience as a teacher and choreographer. We are glad to have her as director of our Color Guard and Winter Guard!



Besides working with our Front Ensemble (Pit) and Winter Percussion groups, Joe Hills teaches band and orchestra at Fox Creek Elementary. He also works with the Blue Knights Winds indoor marching ensemble as music instructor and creative design consultant. During his "free time," Joe volunteers as an elected member of the Rocky Mountain Percussion Association (RMPA) Board of Directors and plays percussion with the Pikes Peak Brass Band in Colorado Springs. Joe has earned a Master of Music in Composition from the University of Missouri and a Bachelor of Music in Tuba Performance from Colorado State University. He marched six years on tuba with the Blue Knights Drum & Bugle Corps as well as six years in the front ensemble with the Blue Knights Percussion Ensembles.



Caitlyn Achilles is a member of the Blue Knights Drum and Bugle Corps and a student at The University of Denver. At the Lamont School of Music, she is studying French Horn Performance and is preparing to get her Masters in Conducting. In high school she and the Valencia High School marching band competed in SCSBOA and MBOS circuits, winning medals every year. During the winter season she participated in the winter percussion group and color guard. Now, she plays the horn with multiple ensembles around Colorado including the Littleton Symphony Orchestra; as well as teaching at HRHS she teaches beginning band at Larkspur Elementary.

## 2020 Marching Band Volunteer Opportunities

The Band Boosters volunteer their time and skills in dozens of ways through the many committees, positions and responsibilities that make our band programs possible. Please consider how you might support the band through volunteering. We are glad to have you as part of our band family!

Parents are asked to participate in at least 2 Volunteer options each year. Please email us at [hrrhsband@gmail.com](mailto:hrrhsband@gmail.com) and let us know which ones you will be involved in this year.

Here is a brief description of the committees, positions and responsibilities that are needed.

**Food Committee** – Feeding our kids is a BIG DEAL! Volunteers are needed to plan, purchase supplies, prep food, donate items, transport, cook, set up, serve, and clean up at all events throughout the season (including band camp week). If food is something you are skilled and/or passionate about, this committee is for you! Sign Up Geniuses will be sent out for specific events, but pre-planning is key to pull off feeding everyone! Not to mention, it's really fun!

**Uniform Committee** - We generally do uniform fittings on the Wednesday afternoon of band camp week (~~est. 7/23/20~~). We will need several people to help with these fittings on that day, including 2 or 3 skilled seamstresses/tailors with sewing machines to make on the spot alterations, so that all of the fittings can be done in one day and make sure that our uniforms look the way we want to sound; which of course is Awesome!

**Transportation/Truck Drivers** – We will need at least 2 parents for each event to drive the school truck and a U-Haul truck carrying props and front ensemble (“pit”) equipment to and from each event, including footballs games and special rehearsals. Trucks and coaches have been reserved by the Treasurer, but a Transportation Coordinator is needed. There will be a “truck driver” slot on each SignUp Genius. No special licenses or training are needed to drive the truck(s), but care should be taken when driving because a lot of expensive equipment is inside! Truck Drivers generally meet at the school for loading and stay after the event for unloading.

**Chaperones** - Chaperones are needed at each event to be available in case any students or staff need assistance. Generally, there are many adults around, but a designated chaperone for each event is recommended. Chaperone slots will be on the SignUp Genius for each event.

**Volunteer Coordinator** – This committee will be responsible for coordinating parent socials and student during the summer and marching season to promote the continued feeling of family and just have a good time. Historically, parent socials have met at The Rio while students met for Laser Tag at Bowler

**Photographer** - We need someone with a penchant for photography to bring a camera to camp and events to take photos, upload them to the Facebook page and create the end of season/year slideshows.

**Banquet Committee** – organizing, decorating, planning food, and coordinating awards for end-of-season Marching Band Banquet in November and end-of-year Band Banquet in May.

**\*\*\*NEW\*\*\* COVID Check In** – New rules and regulations require us to take students temperature and complete a Questionnaire upon arrival to every practice. Parents will be asked to take student temperature with touchless thermometer provided by the school and complete questionnaire on tablet as students arrive. Sign Up Genius will be sent for Band Camp dates.





## 2020 Marching Band Rehearsal Dismissal Time

During the Marching Band season our students are in for a lot of long days. No matter if practice ends at 6:30pm, 8:30pm or Midnight ALL students are expected to stay and help move instruments and equipment back to the band room and store everything properly. Students are not dismissed until after everything is put away. Therefore, pick up time from practice will be approximately 15 to 30 minutes after rehearsal has ended. Please be patient while your student helps their bandmates put everything away. Frequently, parents meet near the end of rehearsal to watch progress for the day and hear the end of the day announcements. This is a great time for parents to chat, ask questions, exchange or pick up items, etc.

If you need to pick up your student immediately at the end of rehearsal on a particular day, please make sure that your student communicates this with BOTH his/her section leader as well as with the staff member who is responsible for that section. If this needs to happen regularly, please discuss the need with Mr. Rigolini directly.

When students leave rehearsal before everything is put away, it makes more work for those who remain and is not fair to those to stay, to the section leaders and to the entire band.

As the season progresses and the band is practicing with full props, it may take longer to disassemble props and store everything. Please be patient and understanding of your student's need to help with this responsibility so that ALL students can leave as quickly as possible. All students need to get dinner, do homework and have other family responsibilities at home after rehearsals; the sooner they are all done, the sooner they can all leave!



## Sample Band Camp Day Schedule

8:30am to 9:00am – body warm up

9:00am to 11:30am – work outside on marching technique and drill

11:30am to 12:30pm – lunch break (each student needs to bring a sack lunch)

12:30pm to 4:30pm – work inside on music/sectional (uniform fittings on Wednesday)

4:30pm to 6:00pm – dinner break (provided by parents/boosters – sign up to volunteer)

6:00pm to 8:30pm – back outside to work on drill and putting it all together

\*\*\* ALL students are expected to stay and help move instruments and equipment to the band room and store everything properly. Students are not dismissed until after everything is put away. Therefore, pick up time from practice will be approximately 15 to 30 minutes after rehearsal has ended. Please be patient while your student helps their bandmates put everything away. Frequently, parents meet near the end of rehearsal to watch progress for the day and hear the end of the day announcements. This is a great time for parents to chat, ask questions, exchange or pick up items, etc.

Is this your first year with Marching Band? **Need to know what to bring for Band Camp?** Please reference this list when packing up each morning so you have everything you need for the long day!

- Instrument
- Sheet music
- Light Jacket or sweatshirt
- Light-colored shirts and shorts recommended
- Full brimmed hat or baseball cap
- Approved Marching Shoes:
  - Tennis shoes, Cross-trainers or Dinkles ONLY
  - NO FLIP-FLOPS, SANDALS OR SKATE SHOES
- Sunscreen **SPF 30 or 45 AT LEAST**
- Insect repellent
- Old beach or bath towel (this will get dirty)
- Snacks
- Water bottles (suggest bringing multiple)
- Prescription medications/inhalers
- **\*\*\*NEW REQUIREMENT\*\*\* Face mask and hand sanitizer**

## Sample Football Game Schedule

3:00 to 4:00 pm - students load trucks after school

5:00 pm - Students and trucks report to event location (usually Shea Stadium)

5:00 to 5:45 - unload trucks and construct props at location (parents are needed at football field to help with constructing props)

6:00 to 6:30 pm - students get in uniform and warm up

6:30 pm – band takes the field for National Anthem, then head into the stands

7:00 – 7:45-ish (until 5 minutes remaining in second quarter) students in stands playing pep band songs

7:45-ish (5 minutes remaining in second quarter) – band and parents move to sidelines to prepare for half-time show

Half-time – performance show (parents needed to help push props and equipment on/off field)

3<sup>rd</sup> quarter – generally students have the 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter off to get out of uniform, get snacks, relax. However, Homecoming game, return to stands ASAP. Usually, parents start to disassemble props, and a few students help with this.

4<sup>th</sup> quarter – students back in stands for pep band

After game – load trucks. When trucks are loaded, return to school

Approx. 9:30 or 10:00 pm - student and trucks arrive HRHS, start unloading (unless competition the next day)

Approx. 10:30 pm-ish - when trucks are unloaded and equipment/props are put away students have very quick meeting in band room, then everyone heads home (rental truck needs to be returned to rental location)

**ALL STUDENTS EXPECTED TO RETURN TO THE SCHOOL AND STAY UNTIL TRUCKS ARE UNLOADED AND EQUIPMENT IS STORED.**



## Sample Competition Day Schedule

7:30 am - students report to the school (trucks are generally loaded on Friday after school, only last-minute items need to be added on Sat. morning)

8:00 am - buses/cars and trucks depart the school

8:30 am - buses/cars and trucks arrive at event location

8:30 to 10 - unload trucks and construct props at location (at some point, all of the students and staff will go as a group to "check-in" and get wrist bands)

10 to 11 - students get in uniform and warm up (some parent help is needed to move pit instruments and equipment to warm up location)

11-ish - all hands on deck to move props and equipment to stadium gate

11:15 - first performance of the day, push props and equipment on/off field, watch performance, then push props and equipment back to trucks, students remove uniforms and put instruments in cases (parents who are helping serve lunch need to go directly to the food area)

12:00 - students, staff and parents who helped with props go to food area for lunch

12:30 to 1:30 - eat lunch

1:30 until 4:30 - down time. Students to stadium to watch other bands, do homework or hang out

4:30 pm - dinner preparations start in earnest

5 to 6 pm - dinner

6-ish - parents clean up dinner, while students and staff start to make their way back to the equipment truck to get into uniform again and warm up (again, some parents will be needed to help move pit equipment to warm up area)

7:15-7:30 - all hands on deck again to move props and pit equipment to stadium for show

7:45 pm - show

8:00 pm - clear the field, move props back to truck and start disassembling and loading

9:00 pm - hopefully the trucks will be loaded and everyone goes to the stadium for results/awards (known as "Retreat")

9:30 pm - As soon as retreat is done, head back to trucks to finish loading (if needed). If trucks are loaded before retreat, students head to buses/cars to return to HRHS

9:45 pm - buses/cars and trucks depart event location

10:15 pm - buses/cars and trucks arrive HRHS, start unloading
